

PreK-Kindergarten Grade Challenge

Prompt: You will get to be a zoologist who is creating a habitat for an animal. It is your job to create a habitat that has all the things the animal needs to survive.

Rules:

- 1. Explain to students that they will choose an animal to create a habitat for at a zoo. They will then decide what things that habitat needs to make sure the animal will survive and be happy.
 - a. The pages at the back of this pack have some suggestions for animals and their habitats.
 - b. Students can also choose their own animals and habitats.
- 2. The habitats must include the following:
 - a. A model of their animal
 - b. Food, water, shelter, and other items to keep an animal safe and happy
 - c. A sign welcoming visitors to the habitat
- 3. The only permitted supplies are recycled materials and common classroom art and building supplies. See page with list of suggested materials.
- 4. Adults can help provide guidance on projects, however we want students to be in charge of creating! We expect all projects to look like children made them!
- 5. Adults must submit the entries by December 8, 2019 at 11pm EST.

Entry must include the following:

- 1. First name of student(s) who completed the project.
- 2. Up to 4 pictures of the project at different angles.
- 3. 3-5 sentences introducing the habitat and the animal. Students can dictate this to the teacher and the teacher can write it out.
- 4. Entry must be submitted as a Powerpoint presentation. Please look at the Challenge website for an example.

Rubric:

30 points: Creativity (out of the box thinking and creative use of materials)

10 points: Solved challenge question (fulfilling the requirements of the prompt)

10 points: Paragraph description on their project (creative and clear explanation of project)



General Supplies List

This is not an exhaustive list – please add your own supplies

Suggested Art Supplies:

- Pipe cleaners
- Tissue paper
- Colored construction paper
- Popsicle sticks
- Markers, crayons, colored pencils
- Glue and tape
- Straws

Suggested Building Supplies and Recycled Materials

- Tinfoil
- Cardboard
- Plastic cups
- Jars
- Loose parts! Nuts, bolts, PVC pipes, tubes
- Fabric
- Egg cartons
- Crazy items! Pool noodles, seashells, etc.

What Animals Need

Read about what each animal needs in its new habitat.

Tarantula:

- A lot of land to build their nests. Tarantulas burrow or build dens out of silk. They don't make the same kinds of webs as other spiders.
- A lot of insects to eat.
- A lot of places to hide.
- Warm, dry climates.



Groundhog

- Groundhogs love to live right on the edge of the woods. Usually, between the woods and a grassland or riverbed is their favorite spot.
- Grasses, berries, and other plants to eat.
- Soil soft enough to dig a burrow in.
- Water to drink.



Pufferfish

- Live in salt water.
- Eat clams and other fish to eat.
- Eat seaweed and grass.
- Swim in warm waters.
